AUSTRALIAN SECURITISATION FORUM (ASF) ANNOUNCE RECIPIENT OF ASF ANNUAL DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

Sydney, Australia. The Australian Securitisation Forum (ASF) last night announced the recipient of the 2007 ASF Distinguished Service Award; Bruce Arnold

Bruce Arnold has been active with ASF education initiatives since their inception. In 1991, he was one of the original lecturers for the Basic Securitisation Course (now Securitisation Professionals Program) and the first notes editor; he still regularly teaches the course. He developed the Advanced Securitisation Workshop in 1994, which he conducts several times each year. The workshop has been attended by over 500 professionals in the domestic market.

Bruce came to Australia in 1989 on a two year secondment to help develop the Australian securitisation market. Bruce led the execution teams on Australia's first pass-through, multiple-tranche, and floating rate Mortgage Backed Securities. Prior to that, he was an original member of the U.S. team that executed the first ever Asset Backed Securities transaction.

About the Award

The Award, presented annually to industry practitioners, is designed to recognise individuals who have contributed significantly to the development and growth of the securitisation industry in Australia.

The ASF invited its members to nominate any individual (regardless of ASF membership status) working within the Australian securitisation industry. Nominations included specific achievements, demonstrated a positive impact on the industry and included the individual's length of industry service. Members of the ASF National Committee were not eligible for nomination.
